GENERAL MEETING

41 attended the Zoom membership meeting, a slide show by Dana Duxbury-Fox and Bob Fox - "Birding the Horn of Africa"

*Maria Curley report on Student Chapter

- Maria met with the AmerCorp volunteer (Asheley) and she is delighted to have Maria do the student chapter of the bird club on any day she wishes. Her club hasn't gotten any students yet because students aren't really staying after school yet, so at this point she has just been walking around the school introducing herself and talking about her club.
- It was announced Friday, 11/20/20 by the BPS Superintendent that all Barnstable schools will be remote-only instead of the normal hybrid model on Monday 11/30 thru Wednesday, 12/02, returning to the hybrid model again on Thursday, Dec 3rd. Students were expected to return from Thanksgiving break on Monday, 11/30, but the return is being switched to remote-only due to the current higher Covid cases in Barnstable and the fact that many families may be traveling or having guests over the break. The three days remote upon return from break will allow for testing results to come in for students and families and time for tracking by school nursing staff.
- Maria's plan for the student chapter of the bird club is to start it as a Remote club on Wednesdays (when all students are Remote), where she will build background on birding, bird species & ecology, birding apps, bird counts, migration, etc.
- The benefits of a remote-only start to the Club will be that more students can join from different student cohorts around the school, so not just a small pilot of 15.
- Once the hybrid learning model resumes, Maria will continue the Remote-only Club on Wednesdays and then also start an In-Person Pilot.
- The Pilot will have a maximum of 15 students from Team 6-South only (Maria's teaching team) each Tuesday (Student Cohorts A & C) and Thursday (Cohorts B & D).
- At this time, student cohorts cannot mix in classroom settings, so the Pilot will start out for her 6-South team only, then as the year progresses and hopefully a Covid vaccine comes out normal activities can resume, the Tue/Thur Club can be opened up to all teams in the school.
