- iii. On completion of the project, the Club should receive three copies of any publications or products along with a final report including an abstract of 250-500 words and some photos suitable for inclusion in the Club's newsletter.

- 4. Purpose (Describe the desired outcome of the project)
- 5. **Description and Methods** (This should be the heart of your proposal. Give any background you feel is appropriate and describe what you propose to do and what methods you will use).
- 6. Timetable (Give the anticipated times for meeting key stages in the project)
- 7. Budget (Give itemized breakdown of use of funds)
- 8. Matching funds or resources (Give any additional funds or resources available for your use)
- 9. **Continuity**: (Do you anticipate the project continuing after expiration of the grant? If so, how will it be supported?)
